Cedar Crest Scholarship

\$43,043* per year

3.0 GPA required for renewal

A full-tuition scholarship awarded to one first-year, traditional student who is the winner of our annual Scholarship Competition.** Additional scholarship money awarded to finalists.

**Based on 2022-2023 annual full-time tuition fee. Scholarship covers full-time tuition minus any additional grants or outside scholarships and supersedes any other Cedar Crest money. **Requirements to participate in the competition: must be admitted to Cedar Crest and have been awarded a Presidential, Trustee or Founder's Scholarship. Students must be able to travel to Cedar Crest College for the annual Scholarship Competition to be eligible.*

Merit Scholarships

Merit scholarships are awarded to traditional, full-time, first-year students based on academic criteria, including but not limited to high school grade point average (GPA), SAT or ACT scores, class rank, and Raise.me.

Students are eligible to receive a merit scholarship and two additional scholarships only. They must also remain in good academic standing for renewal of any scholarships and awards received.

Heritage Award

\$2,000 per year for up to four years

Must remain in good academic standing for renewal

Awarded to traditional, full-time, first-year students whose sister, brother, parent, grandparent, aunt or uncle is a graduate of a Cedar Crest College undergraduate degree program.

Sibling Award

\$2,000 per year for up to four years

Must remain in good academic standing for renewal

Awarded to full-time, traditional siblings concurrently enrolled at Cedar Crest during the regular academic year (fall/spring).

Note: *Students must notify the Admissions Office prior to their acceptance in order to receive a Heritage or Sibling Award.*

Departmental Scholarship

\$1,500* per year for up to four years

Must follow department's criteria for renewal

Scholarships are awarded in all academic disciplines. Interviews and auditions for each scholarship are held for first-year, full-time, traditional students during Departmental Scholarship Day, November 13, 2021 (seniors only).

**Student can receive only one departmental scholarship and must be able to travel to Cedar Crest College for the Departmental Scholarship Day to be eligible.*

Girl Scout Scholarships

GOLD AWARD RECIPIENT

\$5,000* per year for up to four years

Must remain in good academic standing for renewal

Awarded to one student who has received their Girl Scout Gold Award in the previous four years and has a high school or college GPA of 3.5 or better. Applicants are required to provide documentation of receipt of the Gold Award.

GIRL SCOUT INVOLVEMENT

\$1,000* per year for up to four years

Must remain in good academic standing for renewal

Awarded to up to five students who have been an active Girl Scout for at least two years in grades 9-12. Applicants are required to submit a 250-word essay and provide documentation of Girl Scout membership.

Girl Scout Scholarships cannot be combined with the raise.me program, or other community service scholarships offered by Cedar Crest College. **Deadline to apply is November 12, 2021.*

Cedar Crest College is a proud participant in the #YouAreWelcomeHere scholarship program

Cedar Crest College will offer two annual, renewable scholarships that cover a minimum of 50 percent tuition to selected international undergraduate students dedicated to advancing intercultural learning and understanding at Cedar Crest College.

There are a few eligibility requirements:

- You are a first-year traditional undergraduate international applicant to Cedar Crest College. An international applicant is an individual who holds citizenship in a country outside the United States and who does not also possess U.S. citizenship or permanent residency.
- You demonstrate interest and personal initiative in activities involving intercultural learning and exchange.

Required steps to apply for the #YouAreWelcomeHere scholarship include:

- Apply for admission to Cedar Crest College and submit all required application materials.
- Complete a scholarship application, including a 500-1,000 word essay or a 2-5 minute video answering the following prompt: "Tell us about your leadership skills in your school or community, and how you plan to continue applying your leadership skills at Cedar Crest College."

Deadline to Apply:

All application materials must be submitted by January 15 and you must be officially enrolled at Cedar Crest College, and submit your tuition deposit, by May 1.

International Diversity Scholarship

The International Diversity Scholarship is dedicated to diversifying the student body in recognition of our commitment to ensuring that the world's regions, cultures, and ethno-linguistic backgrounds are represented at Cedar Crest College.

Admissions Requirements and Eligibility

- Open to Traditional International Students
 - An international student is an individual who holds citizenship in a country other than the United States and who does not also possess U.S. citizenship or permanent residency
 - Students must be planning to study at Cedar Crest College on an F-1 student visa to be eligible for the International Diversity Scholarship
 - Students must not be receiving government sponsorship
- Accepted to Cedar Crest College having met all other admissions requirements
- Submit an admissions deposit by May 1.

Application Process

- Submit an application and all supporting documents and be admitted to Cedar Crest College
- Submit a scholarship application form
- Submit an essay or video that addresses the following questions:
 - How will receiving the Cedar Crest International Diversity Scholarship help you achieve your personal and professional goals?
 - Define what being a global leader means to you
 - Describe how you will advance intercultural understanding on the Cedar Crest campus

Amount

- One-time award ranging from \$1,000 - \$5,000 will be distributed to those who have been selected to receive the International Diversity Scholarship. The possible number of scholarship winners is restricted, and each student will be evaluated and awarded a scholarship amount individually. The scholarship is renewable for up to 4-years (8 semesters) provided the student maintains a 2.50 GPA and remains in good social, financial and judicial standing. The student must also maintain their F-1 visa status to retain the scholarship.

FINANCIAL AID FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS AND NON-CITIZENS

Student Financial Services (SFS) is dedicated to working with students and families to make a Cedar Crest College education affordable so that students can achieve their dreams.

The SFS staff can help students through the financial aid and billing process to help make the process as easy as possible. While only U.S. citizens and permanent residents may fill out the FAFSA and receive federal financial aid, the SFS staff can also offer valuable information about options for international students and non-residents. This includes information on our EZ Pay payment options.

If you decide to enroll at Cedar Crest College you will receive a bill six to eight weeks before the start of each semester. Books are not included on the bill. You are billed separately for each semester. Payment arrangements must be in place by the due date on the student bill each semester.
