ACADEMIC REGALIA

Academic regalia is traditional clothing worn specifically in academic settings. Traditional academic dress is derived from academic and clerical dress common throughout the medieval universities of Europe and also was worn by members of certain learned societies and institutions as official dress. In the United States, academic dress is rarely worn outside commencement ceremonies or other academic rituals.

Academic dress today generally consists of a gown (also known as a robe) with a (usually separate, unattached) hood and sometimes a cap (either a mortarboard or a bonnet). The gowns most commonly worn are traditionally made of black cloth (although occasionally the gown is dyed in one of the college's colors) and have the material at the back of the gown gathered into a yoke. The bachelor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves, while the master's gown has long sleeves closed at the end, with the arm passing through a slit above the elbow. The hood was originally a functional garment, worn to shield the head from the elements. In the English tradition, it has developed into an often bright and decorative garment worn only on special occasions. The color of the lining of hoods in academic dress represents the institution from which the professor earned his or her highest degree.

In most American schools, the color of the velvet outside of the hood is distinctive of the disciplines to which the degree earned pertains. Some of the colors and degrees you may see at today's ceremony include:

The width of the velvet and length of the hood increases with the level of academic achievement (from bachelor's, master's, to doctorate degrees). The satin field and chevron show the colors of the school from which the wearer is a graduate. The academic cap or square, commonly known as the "mortarboard," has come to be symbolic of academia. In some universities it can be worn by graduates and undergraduates alike. It is a flat square hat with a tassel suspended from a button in the top center of the board. Properly worn, the cap is parallel to the ground, though some people, especially women, wear it angled back. In many universities, holders of doctorates wear a soft, rounded headpiece known as a Tudor bonnet or tam. Those who have served on the faculty at Cedar Crest College for 25 years wear a gold velvet tam.

Cedar Crest College students graduating with academic honors wear colored cords around the neck and hanging loosely down the front. Students graduating with college honors, graduates of the Cedar Crest College Honors program and members of academic honor societies wear honor cords, signifying their scholarship and membership. **Students graduating Summa Cum Laude wear gold cords, Magna Cum Laude wear silver cords, and Cum Laude wear bronze cords.** Academic honor societies at Cedar Crest are also represented with colored cords.

KATE ZERNIKE

Kate Zernike has been a reporter for The New York Times since 2000. She began her tenure as an education reporter and has since worked across the investigations, national, styles, metro and science desks, and as a reporter in the Washington Bureau. She was a member of the team that received the 2002 Pulitzer Prize for Explanatory Reporting for a series of stories on Al Qaeda before and after the terror attacks of 9/11. Since January 2022, she has served as the paper's lead reporter on women's reproductive rights, including abortion.

She is the author of two books: "Boiling Mad: Behind the Lines in Tea Party America" (2010) and "The Exceptions: Nancy Hopkins and the Fight for Women in Science" (2023), which was named one of the 25 best books of the year by the American Library Association and was a finalist for the Royal Society Science Book Prize.

A graduate of the University of Toronto, Zernike began her journalism career at The Patriot Ledger in Quincy, Massachusetts, before joining The Boston Globe. She later joined The New York Times, where she has continued to make a lasting impact on the field of journalism.

Through her fearless pursuit of truth and dedication to informing the public, Zernike exemplifies the kind of leadership and resilience Cedar Crest College graduates aim to carry into the world.
